AfSV condemns Turkish government's policy of awarding assistance to kidnapping and extrajudicial killings

The Alliance for Shared Values condemns a Turkish government policy that places a bounty on the heads of Hizmet participants, as reported by a pro-government news outlet. According to *Yeni Safak*, the government of President Recep Tayyip Erdogan is offering a "homeland award" to people who help find individuals close to the Gulen Movement or help in getting them murdered. Reportedly, \$3.5 million USD has already been paid out to 249 people for information.

President Erdogan has used the July 15, 2016, coup attempt to consolidate his power and become a dictator. In a deeply misguided response to that horrific night, he has persecuted hundreds of thousands of innocent people by firing, jailing, detaining and even torturing them. That he would approve of an outrageous system to pay those who help extrajudicial killings is an altogether new low.

This practice must end immediately, and the rights and freedoms of all innocent people in Turkey must be restored.
